



### **M. Taylor. Brief Biography**

Mike Taylor joined the UK Royal Navy in 1961. He became an engineer officer serving in both conventional and nuclear submarines. He retired with the rank of Commander in 1981.

Mike and his family moved to Canada in 1981 to join the Atomic Energy Control Board, now the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission, as an inspector at the Bruce nuclear site. In 1990 he was promoted to Director and moved to Ottawa. He held several senior management positions in reactor and radioactive materials regulation and was a member of the CNSC Executive Committee.

In 2002 Mike was the Head of Canada's delegation to the International Convention on Nuclear Safety in Vienna. He has participated in numerous international activities for the International Atomic Energy Agency and Nuclear Energy Agency, including being the Canadian member of the Commission on Safety Standards.

Mike retired from the CNSC in April 2003. His final appointment was as Executive Director, Office of Regulatory Affairs.

In 2004 the Governor-in-Council appointed Mike as a temporary member of the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission Tribunal. He served in that capacity from August 2004 to October 2005

Mike is a UK Chartered Engineer, holds a Bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering and a Master's in Nuclear Science and Technology. He was a Fellow of the U.K. Institute of Management and is a member of the Canadian Nuclear Society and the Society for Nautical Research
